Test how well the mobile website engaged new users with opportunities to take action and learn about the organization



## Methodology

**Eight** user tests, facilitated by a moderator who provided tasks and asked questions

## Tasks:

- 1. Signing a petition
- 2. Sharing on social media
- 3. Learning about the Innocence Project through the homepage
- 4. Donating
- 5. Finding other ways to take action

## **Areas for Improvement**

Recommendation 1: **Provide Understandable** & Findable "Calls to Action" Within Stories

- Add "Call to action" buttons which are clearly visible
- Increase understandability by changing the language of the "call to action" button to "sign to petition"
- Add the same "sign to petition" button at the bottom to increase convenience
